In 2015, the Frederick County Detention Center had approximately 200 – 250 new inmates enter the facility each month and on average, these inmates had 180 – 250 children, ages birth to 18. **Children of Incarcerated Parents Partnership** (COIPP) is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization formed to assist families with an incarcerated loved one, while working to educate the community about the issues facing these families.
