## The President's Corner

Spring has finally arrived, uncovering the grass, crocuses, and daffodils from the snow. Likewise, Beth Sholom has been blooming, under the energetic leadership of Rabbi Murray. He has focused primarily on 1) making meaningful, spiritual, halachic Shabbat and holiday services available to congregants who are seeking egalitarian or non-egalitarian services, and 2) revitalizing the Religious School to make it a place where students want to come and continue their Judaic studies, where parents and educators participate in raising proud and knowledgeable Jewish youngsters, and where Jewish learning is enjoyable and meaningful for each member of the family. These two goals are valuable in themselves, but are also directed at increasing our membership, especially being more inviting to young families. We have already seen new vibrancy and inclusiveness in our services and some positive innovations in our Religious School. There have been some glitches, as will happen in any transition, but these have all served to increase my confidence that we have found the right rabbi for the job here at Beth Sholom. Whenever something doesn't go perfectly, Rabbi Murray is always willing to talk with the people involved, listen to people's ideas and concerns, think creatively about solutions and invest himself in researching and implementing improvements. This warmth and willingness to accommodate to varying congregants' needs has laid the foundation for a strong mutual respect between our Rabbi and our congregants. Rabbi Murray's very wonderful wife and children have also contributed to the warmth and vibrancy of our Shul, and I want to thank all of them for their friendliness and positive attitudes. I think we have all made a start on developing mutual

respect, appreciation, and friendship that I hope will grow for many years.

We have scheduled our Annual Congregational Meeting for May 11 at 7 p.m. Our Budget, Financial Investment, Bylaw, and Nominating Committees have been especially busy in preparation. In case I have led you to think that all is milk and honey in the land of Beth Sholom, I need to inform you that the economic crisis and the expenses of renovating two houses for our rabbis have contributed to some budget shortfalls. We do have a plan to fix the problem over the next 3 or 4 years, but we are going to need to do something to raise funds in the meantime. We hope everyone who can will be supportive. The House Committee and Ken Berkowitz have continued to work on renovations to the Second Street house, which was ready for the Singerman family before Passover. The House Committee is also moving ahead on necessary repairs to the downtown synagogue. We are also establishing an ad hoc committee to move us forward on making and implementing decisions regarding the use and future of the downtown synagogue. The Program Committee is continuing to provide interesting programs, and over the next month or two will be hosting programs of special interest to the history buffs and the "Jews in America" aficionados among us. We will have lots of important things to discuss and get your input on at the Annual meeting, so please mark your calendars, save the date, and come.
