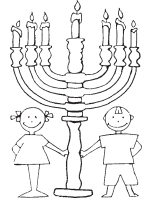

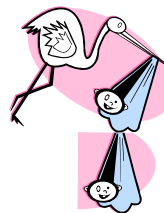

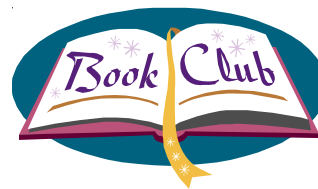
We are happy to tell you that the purse party was a success, and we made close to \$600 towards new carpet in the lobby.

The Beth Sholom Book Club meets every other month on the fourth Sunday, usually at 11:30 am, at Beth Sholom Congregation on 1011 N. Market St. in Frederick, MD. We plan a March 27, 2011 gathering to discuss *The Book Thief*, by Markus Zusak.

This award winning author of *I Am The Messenger* "has crafted an unforgettable novel about the ability of books to feed the soul." This "groundbreaking new novel is the story of Liesel Meminger, a young foster girl living outside of Munich in Nazi Germany. Liesel scratches out a meager existence for herself by stealing when she discovers something she can't resist — books. Soon she is stealing books from Nazi book-burnings, the mayor's wife's library, wherever they are to be found. ... With the help of her accordion-playing father, Liesel learns to read and shares her stolen books with her neighbors during bombing raids, as well as with the Jewish man hidden in her basement." Although the book is sometimes mentioned as a "young adults" book, all the many recommendations to me that we take up *The Book Thief* have come from adults of all ages. A fascinating interview with Zusak, from New Zealand but who was inspired to write the book after hearing his mother's accounts of life in Nazi Germany, can be seen at the Amazon.com web site (book section) where the novel is available new and used and in Kindle format. It's widely available elsewhere as well.
